Originally, the Bièvres Photo Fair was known for its second hand and antique photography market, which continues to be one of its main assets. This year we are expecting some 150 exhibitors who will be presenting a multitude of different articles and offering expert advice. You can find everything at this market: exceptional items from the 19th century, vintage or more recent; articles that are no longer produced commercially; everything from magic lanterns to digital reflex cameras and accessories. Cinematographers will find movie cameras, projectors, posters and movie stills. There will also be collections of old photographs, books, equipment and accesories (photo paper, films, flash attachments, tripods and monopods, lenses, enlargers, and more...). You will have to search through the piles of items, wander through the aisles, chat with the vendors, give free rein to your curiosity! Price ranges are as wide as the choice and quality of items on display.

# THE BIEVRES ENCOUNTERS: LECTURES AND TALKS ON PHOTOGRAPHY

These talks deal with the practical aspects of photography: techniques, travel, equipment.

Well-known photographers like Thomas Vollaire, Eric Delamarre and Agathe Poupeney will be participating, along with representatives of Photographes du Monde and Parisgraphie.

A round table moderated by Gérald Vidamment will be organised by *Compétence Photo* and the HIP Award.

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#### SPECIAL GUEST PHOTOGRAPHER: CLAUDINE DOURY

This year the town of Bièvres will be highlighting the work of French photographer Claudine Doury, after Denis Bourges, Olivier Culmann, Isabel Muñoz, Claude and John Batho, and Jane Evelyn Atwood.

Claudine Doury lives and works in Paris, and is a member of the Agence Vu. Her work is shown at the In Camera Gallery. In her photography she explores the concepts of memory, transition and passage, particularly as illustrated by adolescence and travel, her favourite themes. She has published six monographs and participated in numerous individual and group shows. In 2007, she was awarded both the National Photography Commission for "Youth in France" and the Marc Ladreit de Lacharrière – Académie des Beaux Arts Prize. In 2004, she received the Nièpce Award for her life work. In 1999 she received the Leica Oscar Barnack Prize and a World Press Award for her series: "The People of Siberia".

In Bièvres we will be showing two of her series: "Sasha" and "Loulan Beauty". In "Sasha", she presents the portrait of a teen-aged girl, somewhere between dream and reality. Her portraits depict with great delicacy the complex transition from girlhood to adulthood. Nature is ever present (forests, water, fields, snow). It is a dreamlike world, simultaneously strange and mysterious, attractive and intriguing.

Claudine Doury explains that "Loulan Beauty describes the slow disappearance of a world sinking into the sands of time.

It is a voyage which takes place after the collapse of the Soviet empire, across central Asia and the Xinjiang region of China. *Loulan Beauty* bears witness to those men who are at the centre of the world, heirs to kingdoms that have been swallowed up and disappeared, to fishermen without a sea, to children who dance to bring back their parents who have gone far away to find work, to Lola who dreams of America, to men who can hear the sands singing, to little girls with a thousand pigtails, the same as those that were found on Loulan, their ancestor from 4,000 years ago."

## ARTISTIC CREATION OF ALL FORMS AT THE ARTISTS' MARKET

Whether amateur or professional, individually or as a member of a group, those participating in the artists' market on Sunday will achieve a visibility and recognition which may serve as a springboard to a future career. Nathalie Bocher-Lenoir, president of Gens d'Image and delegate to the Niépce Award will appoint the members of the jury which she will preside. Members of the jury will visit each stall at the artists' market, after which they will deliberate and choose the Grand Winner of the Jean and André Fage Award. Also awarded will be five other prizes including Best Young Photographer and Best Film or Vintage Processes Photographer. All prizes are generously endowed by our sponsors.

### **FESTIVE EVENTS**

The Photo Fair is also an opportunity to enjoy more light-hearted activities. It will be a chance to have your portrait taken at a pop-up studio manned by members of the Paris-Val de Bièvre Photo Club (on Sunday) or to have your picture taken in one of the cut-outs representating old-fashioned advertising posters (Saturday and Sunday, free of charge). There will also be one-on-one portfolio reviews by a professional photographer.

From September to the November school holidays the streets in the centre of Bièvres and around the Town Hall will be the setting of the "In Bièvres, We Love Photography" exhibition organised by the town of Bièvres. Each year the Photo Club organises a photography contest open to the public whose theme is the Fair itself, and will exhibit photos related to "Regards", a publication celebrating the 70th anniversary of the club.
